Flower seeds were planted by **Azure**. The place looks much nicer. **A new group decided to form: a writers group, meeting on Sundays (call Diane Kirksey for information).** **Christine** was a presenter at the **Annual GLAAD Media Awards.** **The Battered Lesbian Task Force** created a brochure to be distributed at the Dallas Association of Family and Marriage Therapy Conference. It will also be used as the foundation brochure for all future outreach on battering. LRC, as a sponsor, has a table for distribution of all of our literature including info for **Umoja Hermanas.** A womyn's spirituality ritual was held the first weekend. **Over 38's, Trykes (formerly, and still, the Under 30's), the Women's Lodge (support and recovery group), Womyn against Racism, Umoja Hermanas, Womyn of Color Poetry and Short Story Group, the Battered Lesbian Task Force..**all had their meetings and all their separate activities. **The Spring Talent Show**, as always, had many surprises including the foot stomping, body moving rhythms of **Rayva**; the continuing Tragi-comedic poetry of **Marlene**; the sweet, gentle lovingness of **Jeanne R** and her sweet remembrance of her Mother. We witnessed the courage of a womyn who, though new to the Centre, participated proudly and honored the LRC by saying how glad she was that the Centre existed for her. **Judy, Linda, Brenda, Cathy, Jenny, Alpha, Lisa, Josi, and Barbara** entertained us. And, then the MC provided an added attraction-an impromptu and bad joke that for many was no joke at all. Some say it was an Anti-Semitic joke; others say it was an anti-German joke (this difference alone shows how much is a matter of perception). 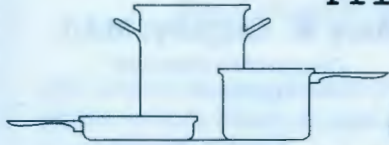

can a Lesbian make an anti Lesbian joke? Is it okay or not okay to make jokes about one's own culture. The joke was bad...the audience left no doubt about that...the audience responded with some booing. Okay, that's happened before. But then...things got pretty heated when **D** demanded an apology for someone else. **B** refused and a short and heated discussion on racism began. The question on whether the Centre was a safe space for everyone was raised. The question on whether this arena (the Talent Show) was the best place to deal with this issue came up. The Talent Show continued with dampened and darkened spirits. The main parties got together after the Show to discuss their perspectives. **Jeanne R** who will be helping to restart the **Womyn for Womyn University Educational Series** suggested that the first class would be on "Is it a Joke? Or Isn't it?" A good place to deal with serious issues. It was a most unhappy situation. The LRC works to end sexism and racism on a daily basis...but it was difficult to know what to do in this situation. All of the participants were either guests or entertainers. Some might believe that what people say at the Centre is the Centre's responsibility. But, while we try to provide a safe place for all (and what does that mean? A safe place...where no one ever says anything insulting, or racist, or sexist, or ageist; or is the Centre a safe place for us to make mistakes, learn from them, and go on?), it can't be guaranteed that no one's feelings will be hurt. It cannot ever be sure that your issue is someone else's issue. It is, however, guaranteed that all of the issues will be discussed. The Centre is not and does not want to be the Lesbian thought and action police. Do you want the Centre to ask people what they think or what they will say before they come in? I don't think so. Dealing with important issues should not make enemies out of us. We all have different ways of handling crisis...one cannot always expect that it will be handled in the way we would like...judging each other quickly can only harm us. Depends on what your goal is...a community of womyn who all believe the same thing or a community of womyn committed to the empowerment of all womyn. One final comment on this: **SEXISM AND RACISM MUST BE ELIMINATED.** How we do that is a matter of personal conviction and choice. There is no one right way to do anything and everybody makes mistakes. And if someone isn't as angry or assertive or aggressive about an issue as you are, it doesn't mean that they are wrong. You may think they are wrong...but that's just one opinion.

The LRC is a non-profit corporation registered with the state of Texas and governed by a Board of Directors. The Bylaws of the organization are available at the Centre for review by all members. Meetings are conducted according to the parliamentary procedures outlined in Alice Sturgis' Rules of Order, which is available in the Library for review by members. The LRC has been granted 501 (c) 3 status by the IRS, and contributions are therefore tax deductible.

Friday Night Dinners



The womyn who prepare dinner on Friday Nights are giving the womyn who participate a gift. They take their time, energy, and money to prepare what they like for unknown womyn. It seems extraordinarily ungrateful and disrespectful for womyn to complain all the time. If dinner is not ready on time, people seem to go crazy. If you don't like the food a particular night, go somewhere else to eat. Don't complain...you are not always going to get what you want. It's impossible. The main focus is not food but conversation and friendship. People are getting their feelings hurt because complaints seem to be constant. The LRC itself is a gift...a labor of love and commitment...it is not a birthright. Please participate by pitching in not by dumping on someone. This little note is in response to the number of womyn who are upset by unfair and rude treatment. The Centre can't make you not be rude...but we can point out that it is very destructive.

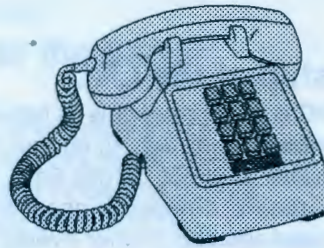

Those Wild and Crazy Telephone Calls



It is a never ending surprise...the phone calls we get. Just on Monday, a woman called and asked about the programs of the Centre. Like a good LRC member, I spent about 5 minutes going over every thing the Centre does. She was not responding to anything, so I asked her what she was interested in. She said she was looking for a date (that is not an unusual phone request).. but the rest of it was! I said that LRC was not a dating or sex service and why ever did she think we would be. Then !!!! It dawned on me to ask...are you a Lesbian? The answer..no. Why are you calling a Lesbian Resource Centre? Well, I thought you were a front for something else. What else? I thought maybe you were a cover for prostitution. You're kidding...you are definitely misinformed about what Lesbians are. Well, I am from a small town..just moved..want to buy a house...need fast money for a down payment. Are you calling us looking for a job? Yes!!!!!!! Well, you have the wrong number and are you aware of the dangers involved... there's AIDS out there and other sexually transmitted disease. You might be able to raise a lot of money fast, but you could die. I spent 22 minutes counseling a heterosexual woman about AIDS and the dangers of acting without thought.

Then there's this guy who calls us all the time. He is paralyzed, uses a computer to talk, is questioning his sexuality, was encouraged to call Gayline, who keeps calling us because he wants to make friends. What do you tell this guy? Who can answer and meet the needs of so many people who are so lonely and so scared. It is so sad. Answering the phone is a real challenge. It is so frustrating to talk to people you can't help...who keep calling back. Maybe, we help a little.

And then there was Alene who was calling for her daughter, who is a Lesbian. Her daughter wants to move out of Dallas and she wants to help her daughter find a place that has a strong womyn's community. Now that is wonderful.

Censorship at the LRC

One of the things that the LRC is very proud of is its newsletter. It is a publication to keep its members informed.. to let members know what is happening at the Centre. It is not, at this time, never has been, nor intended to be, a general newsletter about the Lesbian Community, though articles and ads about other events do appear at times. The focus is the Centre, its activities, and its Membership. Articles about the activities of the Centre and the work of the Board Members have highest priority...these are the activities that form the core of the Centre...this, and the Board Minutes, are the ways people are kept informed. (Everyone, that is, who reads it. Someone came in the other day and complained they didn't know about the Under 30's Dance. She was asked if she got the newsletter. The answer..yes. Well, what's the Centre to do? The Newsletter informs about events...no one can make people read it. It certainly seems easier for womyn to complain than to take responsibility.) Members, first, and, then, readers have always been encouraged to write articles, letters, poetry...but if the Editor doesn't receive anything, it's not printed. The Centre has received letters of complaint and concern...they've been printed. Everything has been printed..the more articles received, the less the work of the Newsletter Committee. Last year, a lengthy article (which criticized the insensitivity and perceived racism of LRC's Director/Coordinator) was submitted, about September or October, 1992; way too long for the newsletter. The article was returned to the writer for editing for a shorter version or division into 2 or 3 parts for consecutive newsletters. THAT ARTICLE STILL HAS NOT BEEN TURNED IN TO THE EDITOR AS OF MAY 13, 1993. LRC is being accused of Censorship and Racism. It appears that womyn are once again not taking responsibility for their own actions or inaction. Though articles are not always printed the month received, the Newsletter Committee has never turned down an article. The Committee wants to thank its Editor for the fine work she does...lay out is a great skill. But nothing like the skill she must use in handling warranted and unwarranted complaints. Thanks very much, Mary Jo. Don't let anyone fool you or mislead you or abuse you, you are doing a great, great service for womyn.

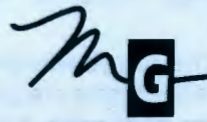

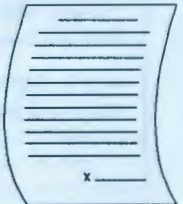

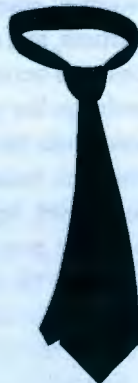
That Fabulous Amanda

Letter to the Editor:

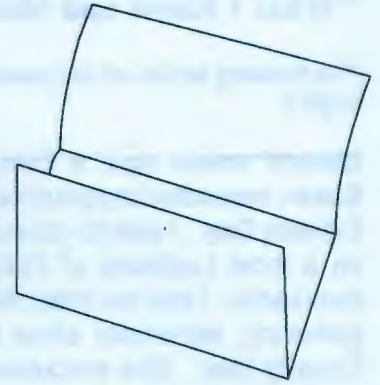

Battered Lesbian Task Force

A call for help....The BLP created a brochure for distribution at the Dallas Association of Family and Marriage Therapy Conference. Designed primarily by Tanea and Christine, the brochure has helpful information and facts about domestic violence. It will be available at the LRC, too. It was discussed whether to print the brochure both in English and Spanish. It was decided, after much discussion, that it would be misleading to print a brochure in Spanish at this time. Though the shelters and programs working with the BLP have multi lingual staff, the Task Force does not. Once the Task Force can locate a Spanish speaking therapist, counselor, or peer counselor, the brochures will be printed in Spanish. Josi M of Umoja Hermanas handles a lot of calls from Lesbians seeking information and help. She was informed that the LRC brochure includes the name and phone number of Umoja Hermanas in its list of resources available to womyn. It is expected that this brochure will reach hundreds of therapists and counselors in Dallas who have no idea about what services and support are available for their lesbian clients. This is such a good way for the LRC to make "contact" with otherwise closeted lesbians. This is such a fantastic opportunity for us to work with and provide support for the larger mental health service community. Task Force meets the 2nd and 4th Mondays at 5:30. Thanks again to Kay Christian who prepared the brochure for printing...she did a rush job for us...she was leaving town and did it in less than 36 hours. Thanks for the cooperation and help, Kay.



“What I Know and Should Have Said”

(The following article will be presented in two segments due to it's length.)

Several weeks ago, a friend of mine, whom I will call Susan, requested my presence at a reception for Women's Equality Day. I was to attend and give some information on a local Lesbians of Color support group that I am involved in. I told her that I didn't think I should attend the gathering, especially since I didn't celebrate Women's Equality Day. She snickered and said, "Well don't celebrate it, just come". I looked at her puzzled, not knowing whether to go into detail on why I refuse to celebrate the holiday. The following day, I met up with her and explained why I didn't observe the day. I informed her that I thought it was a very racist observance, since the suffragettes who lobbied for the measure, had scared the sexist and racist lawmakers of this country into choosing to give the vote to women or to blacks. I repeated Susan B. Anthony's words to lawmakers "And you don't want blacks voting, do you?" The suffragettes had used racism to their advantage and saw no wrong in using it as a tool of intimidation on a, so called, "Feminist" platform. Obviously, they believed that when they were fighting for the rights of women, and in particular the right for women to vote, they meant white women; and most possibly believed that the term "women", under the definition of the laws that they were trying to have passed, did not apply to black women, or any women of color for that matter. We were not considered people, much less any particular sex privileged with rights under the constitution. I also told Susan about a Texas N.O.W. state conference several years ago, where Rainbow N.O.W., a local N.O.W. chapter, tried to get an affirmative action resolution passed to require the state organization to have equal representation from women of color, something the organization has been struggling with for over a decade. The resolution was surprisingly defeated. This occurred at a, so called "feminist" conference. When we tried to absolve the observance of "Women's Equality Day" due to the racist nature of its orientation, all hell broke loose. Women were shouting, standing up and screaming, mostly at us. A white woman, who was sitting in front of us with several of her charter mates, turned around and pointed her finger at my friend Alpha's face, only a few

inches from her nose, and yelled "Don't you blame me for what happened 100 years ago"!! She looked at all of us and with the support of her companions yelled "Don't f__king try to take our history away" (read: Niggers and Spics go home!). We were not trying to take these women's history away, we were simply trying to make them aware of it. And because feminism includes intolerance of racism or any oppression, it only makes sense that these women should be aware of the implications of celebrating such a holiday.

When I recaptured this story for Susan and spoke about the philosophy of Feminism, every word I managed to spit out was met with an "I know that". She, at the time of our second conversation, was working on an article for a local "feminist" publication. In her article she disputed the idea of women's equality day by stating that no woman was free on this earth, so how could there possibly be a "Women's Equality Day"? No woman of any race, class or ethnicity, under the guise of the law, was free to do as she pleases and constantly fears for her life; and with the recent rapes involving the Dallas Police Department, nowhere else was this more apparent. She also made reference to the fact that women are paid less, not paid attention to, placed on pedestals and then abused and discarded, and that along with the children, are the majority of the starving. I told her that I thought her article was not on target because the law is applied differently to people of color in comparison to white people. I did not deny the fact that some men have privilege under the law, and some under the economic system, however, she had lumped all women into one category as receiving the same oppression. Women of color are not placed on pedestals. On the contrary, the patriarchal powers that be take from women of color in order to create a pedestal for white women. Nowhere did she state that for some women, other women are their oppressors as well. Nowhere, in her article, and more importantly in her personal statement, for she considers herself a radical, lesbian, separatist feminist, did she acknowledge her privilege as a white woman. She believed she had none under the law. She place much of the woe's of the world on men. She became defensive when I pointed out that white peoples racism, regardless of sex, is a great obstacle in over 3/4ths of the worlds population. Much to my disappointment, she also did not clarify the history of "Women's Equality Day", as the day white women got the right to vote, even after she agreed she would do so.
