## Arizona Congressman Comes Out More Outings Expected

Congressman Jim Kolbe (R-AZ) acknowledged that he was gay after being outed on an National Public Radio story about the Defense of Marriage Act by reporter Kurt Wolfe. It was also expected to be reported in an August 20 issue of the *Advocate*.

Gay and lesbian activists have been outraged at the overwhelming vote in congress to pass the Defense of Marriage Act (DOMA), which is widely viewed as one of the most anti-gay pieces of legislation to pass the House in recent history. Many people were especially outraged that gay and lesbian members of Congress voted for the bill. This outrage has resulted in some news organizations reporting on gay congressional votes.

An ad that ran this week in the *Washington Blade*, a gay weekly, urged closeted members to come out. Although the ad did not threaten to out anyone, it did encourage gay congressmen who voted for DOMA to "atone for your vote against the community" by coming out. The ad gained attention from the straight press, generating news reports in both the *Washington Post* and the *Boston Globe*.

Kolbe has told the *Arizona Daily Star* that he is "not bitter about this, but I think it's unfortunate for our society that things have to happen this way." He also said, "I am the same person I was yesterday, and I'll legislate just the same way. This should be as irrelevant as the fact that I am blue-eyed, right-handed and balding."

The outings have not come without criticism. The Log Cabin Republicans praised Congressman Kolbe for his "courageous announcement that he is gay" but issued a strong statement condemning the outing.

The Human Rights Campaign (HRC) reports that Koble received a 50% and 60% Congressional scorecard rating in the 102nd and 103rd congress. They also report that he is a sponsor of the Employment Non-Discrimination Act (ENDA) and has consistently voted for the Ryan White Care Act.

Wolfe also outed a congressman in Louisiana on NPR, who may come out over the recess, and there are reports that another congressman in Florida will come out. If this happens, there would be a total of six openly gay congressmen (four Republicans and two Democrats). However, Rep. Steve Gunderson (R-WIS) is not running for re-election. The Update will report any Congressmen that come out in future updates, however, we will not out any individuals.

## Rep. Attacks DOMA

Rep. John Lewis (D-GA) on the floor of the House Of Representatives, July 11, 1996

Let me say to the gentleman that when I was growing up in the south during the 1940s and the 1950s, the great majority of the people in that region believed that black people should not be able to enter places of public accommodation, and they felt that black people should not be able to register to vote, and many people felt that was right but that was wrong. I think as politicians, as elected officials, we should not only follow but we must lead, lead our districts, not put our fingers into the wind to see which way the air is blowing but be leaders.

Mr. Chairman, this is a mean bill. It is cruel. This bill seeks to divide our nation, turn Americans against Americans, sew the seeds of fear, hatred and intolerance. Let us remember the Preamble of the Declaration of Independence: We hold these truths self-evident that all people are endowed by their creator with certain inalienable rights. Among these are life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness.

This bill is a slap in the face of the Declaration of Independence. It denies gay men and women the right to liberty and the pursuit of happiness. Marriage is a basic human right. You cannot tell people they cannot fall in love. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. used to say when people talked about interracial marriage and I quote, "Races do not fall in love and get married. Individuals fall in love and get married."

Why do you not want your fellow men and women, your fellow Americans to be happy? Why do you attack them? Why do you want to destroy the love they hold in their hearts? Why do you want to crush their hopes, their dreams, their longings, their aspirations?

We are talking about human beings, people like you, people who want to get married, buy a house, and spend their lives with the one they love. They have done no wrong.

I will not turn my back on another American. I will not oppress my fellow human being. I have fought too hard and too long against discrimination based on race and color not to stand up against discrimination based on sexual orientation.

Mr. Chairman, I have known racism. I have known bigotry. This bill stinks of the same fear, hatred and intolerance. It should not be called the Defense of Marriage Act. It should be called the defense of mean-spirited bigots act.

I urge my colleagues to oppose this bill, to have the courage to do what is right. This bill appeals to our worst fears and emotions. It encourages hatred of our fellow Americans for political advantage. Every word, every purpose, every message is wrong. It is not the right thing to do, to divide Americans.

## Gay Day At Disney

*The Homophobic Perspective*

### FAMILIES SHOCKED BY HOMOSEXUAL CELEBRATION AT MAGIC KINGDOM

\*Includes eyewitness accounts from Disney World event

The first weekend in June is the unofficial beginning of summer vacation when kids bolt out of their school rooms, pile into the family minivan and head off for the annual respite from the day-to-day grind.

This year many pointed their compasses toward Disney World in Orlando, Florida, unaware of an impending cultural collision with a two-faced "family entertainment" company that welcomed hordes of homosexuals to celebrate their sexual perversions at "The Sixth Annual Gay and Lesbian Day at the Magical Kingdom that Walt Built."

The 1996 "Gay Day at Disney" celebration provided few surprises for those who have watched the infamous gathering over the years. But for the unsuspecting families who happened into the lair of depravity, shock would be an understatement, according to Rusty Pugh, and AFA reporter who witnessed this year's event. Pugh said he saw several families crestfallen as they entered the Magic Kingdom and found themselves surrounded by male and female homosexuals displaying their affections and stereotypical "gay" attitudes. "Families [were] forced to be subjected to this. They [didn't] have any choice," said Pugh in regard to the lack of prior warning families received.

Although Disney does not officially sponsor the celebration, the company seems to accommodate and even welcome it. An internal correspondence from Clyde Min at Disney says: "Each Resort has been asked to supply one Management Team Member to assist with the Gay Pride Day in the Magic Kingdom on June 1, 1996. I am looking for any volunteers who may be interested in helping with this event." Two years ago Disney employees who claimed to be volunteers served as greeters wearing "Gay Day at Disney" T-shirts and handing out a pamphlet promoting the event and asking homosexual patrons to write a letter to Disney to encourage them to allow the event to continue. A report in a New York homosexual

newspaper concerning the 1994 celebration said, "Even Disney has been exceptionally helpful this year."

Since its beginning six years ago, the homosexual celebration has been organized by Doug Swallow, a homosexual activist in Orlando. In earlier years a group of homosexuals who call themselves "Digital Queers" was involved.

Another revealing first hand account of the year's celebration came from "Disney Diary," a column in the Orlando Weekly newspaper. In it writer Jeff Truesdell recounts the day and the invasion of red shirts – the traditional color choice for the homosexuals during their day at Disney. The column implies that many Disney World workers are homosexual. Truesdell writes: "Take away the gay workers... and Disney World becomes the planet's largest self-service theme park." The newspaper also describes an occasion when a parking attendant, upon seeing the crimson-attired passengers in one vehicle, waved them through without collecting the \$5 parking fee. Even the afternoon Disney parade down the theme park's Main Street – a favorite family event – portrayed strong homosexual overtones, according to Truesdell. The performers in the parade, paid by the company that claims to have no connection to the homosexual celebration, were decked out in – you guessed it – red costumes.

Disney's claim not to sanction the event could more easily be believed if the company were consistent in applying policies concerning groups that come en masse to their theme parks. Disney claims it can't deny admission to someone only because he belongs to a group which might upset other patrons.

However, dozens of gang members visiting Disneyland in California were evicted recently after they entered the park wearing gang colors. Kenneth Green, Director of Corporate Communications, said the company was concerned the group might intimidate or invoke fear in the hearts of mainstream patrons.

Even families who knew about the homosexual event before making the trip to Orlando were met with problems. David Caton of AFA of Florida reports instances where families were told they would not be given a refund on their deposits.

**MAPPLETHORPE  
REVISITED IN CINCINNATI  
OBSCENITY TRIAL**

(GLAAD) On August 5, Gary Allgier, owner of the gay bookstore The Pink Pyramid, and two clerks will go before the Ohio First District Court of Appeals on obscenity charges for renting world-renowned filmmaker Pier Paolo Pasolini's critically acclaimed *Salò: 120 Days of Sodom*. "This is a trial that should not be taking place," said Leanne Katz, executive director of the National Coalition Against Censorship (NCAC). Katz suggests that, like the 1990 Mapplethorpe case when city prosecutors charged the Contemporary Arts Center with obscenity, this latest obscenity trial cast Cincinnati officials as "oppressive, obsessive anti-obscenity crusaders [that] seek out lesbian and gay targets." More than a dozen organizations including the NCAC, American Civil

**GAY SOLDIERS  
TARGETED IN  
HAWAII WITCH  
HUNT**

The Servicemembers Legal Defense Network (SLDN) reports that military prosecutors are aggressively questioning suspected gay male servicemembers at Hickam Air Force Base and elsewhere in Honolulu, in violation of "don't ask, don't tell, don't pursue." The most recent round of investigations began with a criminal conviction and an offer of a reduced sentence for one Air Force member for identifying other servicemen engaging in consensual gay sex. At least 17 servicemembers from all branches have been targeted. One has been separated, two await discharge and at least one other faces possible court-martial and jail-time. The Department of

**ACTION STILL NEEDED  
ON DEFENSE OF  
MARRIAGE ACT**

(HRC) This is a critical moment in the drive to end job discrimination based on sexual orientation, so everyone who cares about fairness should contact their U.S. senators immediately. Urge your senators to support the Employment Non-Discrimination Act (ENDA, S. 932) as an amendment to the Defense of Marriage Act (DOMA, S.1740), and tell them to oppose DOMA itself. DOMA, the anti-marriage bill, is rocketing through Congress.

Since the House passed the anti-gay marriage bill July 12, the Senate is our only hope for something positive to come out of this election-year spectacle. The bad news is that DOMA is virtually certain to pass the Senate. The good news is that it can at least deliver some basic fairness in the workplace if we each do our part to have the Senate pass the ENDA amendment to it.

The so-called "Defense of Marriage Act" would allow states to ignore gay marriages performed in other states, and would create an unprecedented federal definition of marriage to exclude gay unions from all federal benefits should any state decide to legalize same-sex marriage.

The Employment Non-Discrimination Act would protect Americans from job discrimination based on sexual orientation. President Clinton endorsed the Employment Non-Discrimination Act last October.

With your help, the ENDA amendment has a decent chance of succeeding in the

Barr, Dole, Gingrich, Limbaugh and other conservative serial monogamists outspoken in their opposition to same-sex marriage back into domesticity with their first spouses?"

Senate. ENDA has 30 Senate co-sponsors, including two Republicans. ENDA also enjoys the support of major corporations such as Eastman Kodak, Quaker Oats and Bethlehem Steel, and Republican Govs. William Weld of Massachusetts and Christine Todd Whitman of New Jersey.

Gay marriage is not legal in any of the 50 states. However, it is legal in 41 states to be fired from your job simply because you are gay. Congress should focus on the real problem of job discrimination against gay people that affects Americans right now. A Hawaii court case that has sparked the same-sex marriage debate is not expected to be decided for approximately two years.

Contact your U.S. senators immediately and urge them to support the Employment Non-Discrimination Act (S. 932) as an amendment to the so-called "Defense of Marriage Act" (S. 1740), and also express your opposition to DOMA itself. Use the sample letter below as a guide for what to say. Refer to each bill by its appropriate number. Write, call, fax, and e-mail your senators.

### Sample Letter to Your Senators

Dear Senator Hutchison:

I urge you to support the Employment Non-Discrimination Act (ENDA), S. 932, as an amendment to S. 1740, the so-called "Defense of Marriage Act" (DOMA). DOMA is nothing more than ratification of election-year gay-bashing, and is most likely unconstitutional. Should S. 1740 reach the floor of the Senate, ENDA will be offered as an amendment to DOMA. I strongly urge you to support the ENDA amendment and oppose DOMA.

Even proponents of DOMA claim not to be in favor of discrimination -- so just about anyone can easily support the ENDA amendment. ENDA would protect Americans from job discrimination based on sexual orientation. Though it is not legal for gay people to marry anywhere in the United States, in 41 states it is still legal to fire good workers just for being gay. Until ENDA passes, there is no federal law to protect Americans from this pervasive unfairness.

ENDA is a very reasonable bill. It would prohibit job discrimination, quotas and other forms of preferential treatment in the workplace based on sexual orientation. It would not apply to religious organizations, small busi-

nesses or the military, and it would not require domestic partner benefits.

Americans overwhelmingly believe that lesbian and gay people should not lose their livelihoods to discrimination. According to the latest Newsweek poll, 84 percent of Americans support equal rights for gays in terms of job opportunities.

Furthermore, a recent poll by the Mellman Group found that there is no clear consensus among Americans on DOMA, and that 73 percent feel that other issues are much more important.

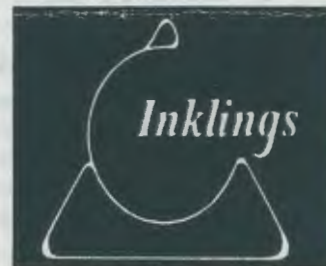
I oppose DOMA because I believe that marriage is a basic human right. The decision of whom to marry is a deeply personal one that should not be interfered with by the federal government. Despite the rhetoric of the religious political extremists, one can honor the relationship between a man and woman without attacking lesbian and gay people or their relationships.

Again, since gay marriage is not legal anywhere in the land, but anti-gay job discrimination is widespread and legal just about everywhere, I urge you to support the Employment Non-Discrimination Act as an amendment to the Defense of Marriage Act, and oppose DOMA itself.

I look forward to hearing your views on this matter.

# BOB PARIS AND ROD JACKSON SPLIT UP

The famous gay couple Bob Paris and Rod Jackson have broken up.

In a statement faxed [to this news service] by Paris on July 18, the bodybuilder/model couple said: "Rumors have been circulating in the gay community regarding the status of our relationship, and while neither of us is comfortable discussing the very private aspects of our lives, we want to address those rumors directly to prevent any misunderstanding.

"For the public record, we have been broken up for the last year and were separated for a year before that. The past two years have been an extraordinarily difficult time for both of us as we have faced the dissolution of our marriage. The details and reasons for our separation are complicated, painful and personal, as they are when any marriage fails. And while our marriage was lived in the public

eye for many years, its demise is not a subject either of us can expand upon in the media. We have tried to handle the breakup in a mature, quiet fashion, and are trying now to find new ways to still be in each other's lives.

"We tried our best to make our marriage work," the always-publicity-sensitive couple continued. "We loved each other deeply and had ten years together. Seven of those years were spent as activists for gay civil rights and we were fortunate to have been able to do some very difficult, rewarding and exhausting work together. Like so many couples, we found ourselves in very different places, and our partnership could no longer be the source of joy and shelter it was for so long. Living and working so much in the public eye, our marriage took on a life of its own, and our full schedule of gay rights activism often came at the expense of sustaining our personal relationship.

"We share the disappointment of those of you who looked up to our marriage as a role model - no one feels that disappointment more

keenly than we do," Jackson and Paris said. "But as individuals we need to move on and look forward, as any other couple, gay or straight, would at this point in their lives. We both remain completely committed to the cause of making the world a better, safer place for gay, lesbian and bisexual youth. We both remain deeply committed to the concept of equal marriage rights, and we both still believe in the magic of love."

In a telephone conversation, Paris - a former Mr. America and Mr. Universe - said the couple prepared the statement because, "I think readers of the gay press are interested."

Paris and Jackson got married in 1989, after Paris came out publicly in the July 1989 issue of the muscle magazine Ironman. Thereafter, they spent several years as sort of free-lance gay role-models - showing gay and straight America that two All-American guys could fall in love and live happily every after.

They made scores of speaking and television appearances, and released a coffee-table book of photos of themselves.
